




HOW TO STUN SHEEP

Stunning is vital to make sheep unconscious before slaughtering. They can then be **slaughtered painlessly**. The tips below cover best practices used in small slaughterhouses and will help you stun sheep efficiently.

Only workers holding a certificate of competence are allowed to stun sheep.

ABOUT SHEEP

- Sheep can get anxious when separated, which can make them behave unpredictably (e.g. running, jumping, knocking over their handlers)
- ◆ They tend to move from dimly lit to brighter areas
- → Like: staying in groups
- → Dislike: shining or extremely bright lights, reflections, shadows, obstacles, noise, sudden movements
- ★ Each sheep can act in a different way



BEFORE STUNNING


PREPARE THE SHEEP AND EQUIPMENT

- Check that the sheep's wool is dry
- ★ Make sure that the electrode pins are wet
- Check the tongs you are using are the right size and not corroded
- ♦ Wear rubber gloves and boots

PLACE THE HAND PLIERS WITH ELECTRODES

- Between the outer corners of the sheep's eyes and the base of their ears
- Alternative: Using a head-to-back handset, place the handset between the sheep's ears with the electrodes on the top of their head.





DURING STUNNING

Minimum voltage (volts – V) 1.0-1.3 Minimum PARAMETERS FOR HEAD-ONLY ELECTRICAL STUNNING Minimum current (hertz – Hz) Minimum duration (seconds) >2 >2

CHECK FOR CONSCIOUSNESS Make sure the animal is unconscious before sticking. no blinking (spontaneous or when eyes are touched) no response to pinching/pricking of nose/ear no regular breathing stiff/extended legs, followed by twitching/kicking

AFTER STUNNING

IF THE SHEEP IS STILL CONSCIOUS

- ♣ Don't stick it
- Stun again with the back-up method (e.g. penetrative captive bolt)
- Identify what went wrong
- Correct any problems before resuming stunning

QUICKLY SLAUGHTER THE SHEEP

→ Bleed the sheep within 8 seconds of stunning

CONFIRM THE DEATH

Check for:

- No spontaneous movements
- Limp/permanently collapsed body
- No response to pinching/pricking of nose/ear
- No noise/panting
- No regular breathing
- → Dilated pupils
- Bleeding stopped
- No heartbeat/pulse
